Planning for Pleasure

A commitment-free weekend or summer may seem like the perfect antidote to a difficult work or school schedule, but psychologists' studies reveal that you are far better off to maintain more structure in your "free" time. The contrast in activity levels produces "weekend migraines" in some people, loneliness and boredom in others. One study had its subjects carry a notebook, and jot down their feelings and mood at specific intervals throughout the day. The subjects consistently felt more "at peace," satisfied," "comfortable" when engaged in a "Without a planned activity. structure to our free time," says Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi, Ph.D., a professor of psychology at the University of Chicago, "we become more depressed than relaxed. Free workday directives obligations, our minds naturally turn to worries. But when we plan our free time, we give ourselves control and focus - two things that generate positive feelings. Savor the fact that you can choose how you'll develop your time."

ANNUAL GROUP PIANO RECITAL MAY 31, 2014

By now, you know if your child will be performing in recital on May 31, 2014. Thank you for returning the student biographies and attending the first workshop. (Students participating in Keiki Kani recitals must attend the three Performance Workshops immediately prior to the recital; absence from these workshops is considered cause to drop the student from the recital.) These workshops are designed to encourage preparation (practice), allow the students to rehearse their music in front of a "friendly" audience (students and teachers only), help alleviate stage fright, and teach stage presence and etiquette. Few students possess the self previous -confidence or experience necessary to overcome an unpredictable audience, a memory lapse, or stumbling fingers; therefore, attendance at these workshops is ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY and MANDATORY. All workshops are held at Aiea, one Saturday each month, 2:00-3:00 pm; recital locations are as announced. Please review your recital information sheet for recital attire and workshop dates. For your reference, the June 2013 recital and workshop dates are listed below:

SUMMER MUSIC PLANNING

Attention to all current students! After the long, dreary school year is over, you'd like to take a break from homework, practice, and classes and just kick back, right? Well, we agree you probably could use a break from your school activities, but it is not wise to stop your music! During the summer, it is important that you continue your music lessons/classes. We do not recommend you take a break longer than two weeks*: we're afraid you'll forget your hard-learned music skills, and worse yet, lose technique (finger dexterity/speed for piano students, tone and pitch range for voice/choir students).

Instead of the hum-drum ritual of your regular classes (and we teachers know it can be boring, tedious, and a downright chore to practice - we thought so too when we were in your shoes - in fact, practicing is the number one thing most people dislike about music lessons, so you're not alone!) we suggest you try a different, possibly more interesting and intriguing form of Keiki Kani music lessons during the summer.

During the summer we suggest you enroll in Choir (10 weeks, performance in August), or Hana Hou (a new course for continuing piano students, featuring units in speed-reading, theory, composition, history, and performance ensemble—culminates in August recital).

Make-Up Classes & Schedule Changes

If you must miss your class/ lesson, please call the Aiea office (#487-2275) as soon as possible to schedule a make-up class/lesson (if available) or get that weeks' assignment. IMPORTANT: During the Spring Observation Period (May 3-31) please make every effort to attend your class (not a make-up). Make-ups during this period will be allowed only with your teacher and only with your teacher's consent: in preparation for the observation period, each class prepares a unique presentation/piece for their parents and they need to practice with their own class and their own teacher.

Also, if long-term/permanent schedule changes are necessary, please notify your teacher WAY IN ADVANCE. Most classes are locked-in to their day/time and last minute transfers can be made only if a compatible class day/time can be found; schedule changes are easier to make at registration time (as opposed to mid-session).
